Study examples of dichotomous keys, like the ones below or others you might find in a field guide. There are a variety of ways you can design a dichotomous key, and they can be used to identify pretty much anything. Figure 1 below is a dichotomous key for types of potato chips, and Figure 2 is one. This is an adaption of a resource I downloaded from TES. The images can be added to Inspiration so that the key can be completed electronically. At the end of this dichotomous keys lesson plan, students will be able to examine organisms or their structures such as insects or leaves and use dichotomous keys for identification. Dichotomous Key.
