Elizabeth's first impression of Darcy was dead on. When she met him at the ball, he was proud and arrogant. He made no attempt to conceal the fact he would rather have been anywhere else, or that he would have preferred the company of others. The title *Pride and Prejudice* refers (among other things) to the ways in which Elizabeth and Darcy first view each other. The original version of the novel was written in 1796-1797 under the title *First Impressions*, and was probably in the form of an exchange of letters. *Pride and Prejudice* is basically the result of the same kind of thing, turn of the 19th century-style. Originally, the novel was going to be called *First Impressions*, but after Austen hit the big time with the blockbuster sales of *Sense and Sensibility*, her publisher asked if they could try for a little branding magic by sticking to the same title formula: noun-and-noun.
